

30 days. After the time indicated you that it IS being addressed. has passed, there will be an inspection to check for compliance. If the violation still exists, a second letter will be sent with a date to bring the violation into compliance.

At this point, violation remains, a hearing before the Covenants Committee will be scheduled. A 14 day notice must be given and since the Covenants Committee meets once each month, the scheduling can take up to a month. At the hearing, the Covenants Committee informs the homeowner of the violation and the steps that will be taken if the violation is not brought into compliance. We are then informed of the committee's decision and how we are to proceed.

NEW BEGINNINGS

Springtime is associated with new beginnings as the weather warms up and the trees sprout their leaves and flowers. It is also time for Southbridge's Annual Meeting on May 28^{th} when you have the opportunity to have a say in how our community is run by electing representatives to the Board of Directors. Join us at the Southbridge clubhouse at 7 p.m. to participate!

Three people are elected to three-year terms every year on our nine-person board. We encourage you to read the bios of the candidates for the board and vote for the ones you want to see working on your behalf.

There is a lot new in and around Southbridge. Last year saw the addition of the waterslide at the clubhouse pool, state-of-the-art resurfaced tennis courts and wind-screens, decorative event announcement signs along both Wayside and River Heri-tage, as well as a new patrol service with extended hours of coverage. This year, you will notice new landscaping throughout the community, updates to the pools themselves (including the addition of a handicapped entrance to the wading pool as mandated by the U.S. Justice Department under the Americans with Disabilities Act), new banners in the clubhouse parking lot, and the addition of a pavilion next to the clubhouse playground.

The Virginia Department of Transportation is working on the Swans Creek restoration project in the area behind the clubhouse on the other side of Barrley Drive between Terri Court and Glennville Drive. There has been severe erosion over the past few years caused by water run-off into the creek from I-95. Construction of the new HOV/EZ-Pass Express lanes on I-95 has brought in the funding to correct this problem and ensure that the erosion will be checked.

Sometime in June, our next door neighbor community, Potomac Shores, will debut their first model homes. This comes roughly a decade after the land was split off from Southbridge and sold by Southbridge's developer, Legend Properties. After some false starts and the collapse of the housing market in 2008, SunCal came in and purchased the property. Representatives from SunCal will be present at our Annual Meeting to provide an update on their plans, including the Jack Nicklaus Signature Golf Course that is expected to open late summer.

Second District State Delegate Mark Dudenhefer, who represents parts of Prince William and Stafford counties including Southbridge, will also be in attendance at our meeting to discuss improvements to U.S. Route 1 funded by Virginia's new transportation law.

Be sure to join us on May 28th at the Southbridge clubhouse for our Annual Meeting and have your say!

Pool Registration

Dear Homeowner:

The time has come to issue facilities passes for the 2013 season. Beginning April 22, 2013 facilities passes will be issued for the 2013 pool season. A facilities pass will be issued to all unit owners, members of their families residing in the unit, and to the designated tenants of unit owners. The homeowner must present identification (i.e. current driver's license, birth certificate, valid picture ID) to the Management Office staff at the time they submit the form. After verification of residence, the homeowner must complete and sign the Pool Use Agreement. At this time, 2013 facilities passes will be issued. If you are a new resident and have not yet obtained a facilities pass, you will need to complete all paperwork mentioned above and bring all members on the list to the clubhouse to have photos taken.

NOTE: Assessment accounts must be current in order to obtain passes.

If you are an offsite owner and are renting your home, you must authorize your tenants to use the facilities. All tenants must provide a copy of their lease after the Tenant Designation Form has been provided to the office by the homeowner. Homeowners must contact the office and a form will be delivered to them. All onsite owners need to only fill out the regular pool pass application not the tenant designation form.

Please note that the Association office will be closed on Monday May 27, 2013 and all Sundays. **Facilities passes will ONLY be issued during hours listed above. There will be no exceptions**.

GIRL SCOUT COMMUNITY AWARENESS PROJECT

Swans Creek Junior Troop 5285 is currently working on their Agent of Change Journey and has decided on a Community Awareness Project to bring attention to the plight of animals in the community. The scouts have learned that there are two important organizations in the county that are dedicated to helping animals, the Prince William County Animal Shelter and the Prince William SPCA.

The Prince William County Police Department's Animal Control Bureau is responsible for the Animal Shelter. The Animal Control Bureau is responsible for:

Enforcing animal welfare laws

Conducting animal education seminars

Housing stray and unwanted animals in a clean and safe environment

Coordinating the adoption of animals

Investigating complaints of cruelty to animals

Providing 24-hour emergency service for injured or stray animals

Removing stray dogs and livestock from streets and public areas.

The Prince William SPCA is assisting the Prince William County Animal Shelter to place adoptable shelter animals on Petfinder (<u>http://www.petfinder.com/shelters/pwcshelter.html</u>). The PWSPCA is dedicated to protecting domestic animals from cruelty, neglect, and abandonment, and stopping the unnecessary overpopulation of companion animals. Their goal is to end the euthanasia of adoptable cats and dogs in Prince William County. For additional information visit the PWSPCA website at <u>www.pwspca.org</u>. The PWSPCA also sponsors a Pet Food Pantry at the Manassas City Animal Adoption Center where needy families can obtain food assistance for their pets. The P.A.W. Express mobile pet adoption van will be at the Prince William County Community Expo taking at the Pfitzner Stadium Complex in Woodbridge on May 4 from 11:00am-4:00pm.

The community can help shelter animals by donating Kuranda dog beds at <u>www.kuranda.com</u>. The food pantry in Manassas is also accepting donations of food in its original, sealed container. You can donate any wet or dry pet food for puppies, dogs, kittens, cats, birds, and rabbits. Other needed items are new and unused toys, litter and other pet supplies. Donations of gift cards from Wal-Mart, Target, Wegmans, and other stores where pet food is sold may be mailed directly to the Prince William SPCA at PO Box 6631, Woodbridge, VA 22195.

Animals are brought into the shelter at an unbelievable rate. Stray animals taken into the Prince William County Animal Shelter have a minimum 7-day grace period, after which Virginia State law dictates the animal may be euthanized. Surrendered animals are evaluated immediately for adoption or euthanasia. Unfortunately, not all animals brought to the shelter find homes.

You can save a life by adopting from the shelter. Troop 5285 hopes to meet its project goal by having animals adopted from the Prince William County Animal Shelter during the months of May and June. If you adopt during those months, please send an email to the scouts at <u>juniortroop5285@gmail.com</u> to let them know that their project has made a difference and that they have helped save an animal's life.

REPORT FROM SUPERVISOR CADDIGAN

I am pleased to introduce Prince William County's new Chief of Police, Steven M. Hudson. The Prince William Board of County Supervisors announced Chief Hudson's promotion on February 5, 2013. Applicants from around the country applied for, and were interviewed for, this highly sought after position. Chief Hudson has lived in Prince William County for the past 37 years and has been with the Police Department for 30 of those years. During his service he has served as a patrol officer, plain-clothed detective, Sergeant and First Sergeant supervising units in Juvenile, Academy and Patrol Bureaus. He served in line functions as SWAT Team Leader and Academy Instructor. He was promoted to the Command Level serving as Lieutenant and then Captain in charge of Special Operations, Internal Affairs and Vice/Narcotics Bureaus. He has served since 2008 in the Senior Executive Level of the Department as Assistant Chief first in charge of the Operations Division and then the Criminal Investigations Division. "I am humbled and more than honored to be selected to serve as the third police chief



ELECTRONIC VOTING

Again, this year homeowners will have the ability to vote online for members of the Board of Directors during a period of time prior to the Annual Meeting which has been scheduled for May 28, 2013 at the Southbridge Swim and Racquet Club.

Registered users of the Southbridge website, with valid email addresses, will receive an email notification of the Annual Meeting including the list of candidates and procedures for online voting in addition to the usual notification sent by US Postal Service mail. Information on how to vote online will also be included in the USPS mailing. Each homeowner will receive the same access code on both email and USPS mail so that they can only vote once.

There are things that you as a homeowner can do the make the process run smoothly.

If you are not already a registered user of our website, register for the website at <u>southbridgeva.us</u>.

If you are a registered user insure that your email address is up to date and correct. If you have changed email addresses you have the ability to change it in your user profile. Please do not remove any street address or phone number information; this is not visible to other users as long as you have checked the "Hide from Address Book" box.

Add the domain "vote-now.com" to your spam filter "white list". This will prevent the voting information from being flagged as spam by your software.

All members of the Southbridge Community Association (homeowners) should expect to see either an email and/or a USPS mail concerning the Annual Meeting and Election of Directors by the end of April or very early in May. The mailing is required to take place the day following the "Record Date" which is tentatively set as April 23, 2013. The Record Date is the official date when the list of members is generated for the purpose of holding the election.
