TRASH REMOVAL

The trash company is diligently working to return service to Tuesday's and Friday's. They are hoping this can be done November 1st. We will put out the notice as soon as we know. In the mean-time please be mindful of the weight of any trash bags that are left out on the ground and not in a container, if the bags are too heavy, they will not be taken. Make sure all leaves are bagged properly this fall and placed out on the second trash day of the week, which is now Saturday. Do not mix leaves with any other trash or debris. The trash service is also getting strict on not emptying trash containers that appear to have items that should not be in them, such as recycling items, yard debris, etc. They will also not take trash bags that appear to be too heavy as if they'll bust open they are not responsible for cleaning up the mess.

POOL SEASON

Seems pool season came and went before we knew it. The pool is all closed and taking a rest in order to get ready for May 23, 2020, opening day of the pool. Remember to put your pool passes in a safe place over the winter as you will use the same ones. We start issuing pool passes for new residents on April 1, 2020. See you next year.

The committee meets the first Wednesday of each month and is responsible for planning the events and helping the day of each event. If we cannot get more committee member's we may need to evaluate the events and begin cutting back. Community Trash Cans

Please be advised that the community trash cans are here for the convenience of our residents, while walking their dog or just out on a stroll. The community trash cans are NOT to be used for household trash disposal (please see the picture below).

Anyone committing this violation will have their HOA account assessed a special pick-up charge, as American Disposal will have to be called in to remove it. Thank you for your understanding that all Association Members are subject to the same rules and restrictions as defined in the governing documents.



TRASH REMOVAL

Trash Removal continues to be done on Wednesday and Saturday with Saturday also being recycling and yard waste. American Disposal is reporting that there are many homes who are not disposing of their trash properly causing the trash containers to be left behind. On Wednesday only household trash is picked up. If the trash guys see anything in the container that should not be there, they will not dump the container, such things as cardboard, paper, yard waste etc. is considered contamination. For Saturday pickup do not place recyclables in the household trash containers and all yard waste must be separated from the household container. Branches must be no longer than 4 feet and must be tied in a bundle. Appliances, mattresses, large furniture and construction debris will not be picked up, you may call American Disposal at 703-368-0500 to arrange for these items to be picked up for a fee. If the Association has to call in for these items to be picked up it is more costly and if we know who put the items out the cost will be charged back to the owner. Improper disposal of trash can affect the budget so please help in disposing of your trash properly.

We couldn't have pulled it off without you!!





Comfy Beef Stew



Ingredients

- 2 pounds stewing beef trimmed and cubed
- 3 tablespoons flour
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 onion chopped
- 1/2 cup red wine optional
- 6 cups beef broth
- 3 tablespoons tomato paste
- 1 teaspoon dried rosemary or 1 sprig fresh
- 1 pound potatoes peeled and cubed
- 4 carrots cut into 1 inch pieces
- 4 celery stalks cut into 1 inch pieces
- 3/4 cup peas
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 2 tablespoons water

Instructions

- 1. Combine flour, garlic powder and salt & pepper. Toss beef in flour mixture.
- 2. Heat olive oil in a large Dutch oven or pot. Cook the beef and onions until browned.
- 3. Add red wine and beef stock while scraping up any brown bits in the pan.
- 4. Stir in all remaining ingredients except for peas, cornstarch and water. Reduce heat to medium low, cover and simmer 1 hour or until beef is tender (up to 90 minutes).
- 5. Mix equal parts cornstarch and water to create a slurry. Slowly add the slurry to the boiling stew to reach desired consistency (you may not need all of the slurry).
- 6. Stir in peas and simmer 5-10 minutes before serving. Season with salt & pepper to taste. Source:Spendwithpennies.com


